Sunday April 27th 2025 Divine Mercy Sunday

(Gospel - John 20: 19-31)

The difficulty – for want of a better word – about Easter is that for many it's associated with holidays and as these now come to an end, the cycle of work and life continues as normal, schools re-open and we move into the season of exams, Holy Communions, Weddings and whatever. But in church we will continue to celebrate the season of Easter, the Rising of Jesus and his appearances to those with whom he was intimately connected right up until the day of Pentecost in five weeks or thereabouts. This will continue while for so many the thoughts of celebrating Easter are being left behind, if not already gone.

Which is why reflecting on today's Gospel is so important – it is as dramatic and impacting as the Resurrection itself.

There are three clear elements in this Gospel of John.

- 1] Peace
- 2] Being Sent out on Mission and
- 3] Belief

And look how all of them are brought together.

Jesus breathes on them ... it recalls how God in the creation story of Genesis breathed life to make the first human. So now Jesus breathes new life into his people. His followers. It is post-Resurrection, post-Easter and they should be rejoicing. Why are they afraid? Why do they have closed doors? All that Jesus had said would happen is happening, so they should be brave even before this.

Today, the Gospel speaks to you. Jesus breathes life into you, giving you peace – that's his peace we offer one another, not our own. That is what we must remember when offering the sign of peace at Mass. It's not your peace being offered; it is the great gift of Jesus himself and who are we to withhold it?

These words of Jesus inspired the faithful to live as we are told in the Acts of the Apostles. They inspired John to write the book of Revelation/ Apocalypse, a book that is open to much interpretation but nevertheless is about the glory of God shining through all the negativity of life.

The breath of Jesus gives us courage to go out and be courageous in living as Christians – that's not about preaching from the rooftops or on the streets. It's just courage to live our daily lives, to receive our daily bread, as Christians.





A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 5:12-16

The faithful all used to meet by common consent in the Portico of Solomon. A reading from the book of the Apocalypse Apo 1:9-13.17-19

My name is John, and through our union in Jesus I am your brother and share your sufferings, your kingdom, and all you endure. I was on the island of Patmos for having preached God's word and witnessed for Je sus; it was the Lord's day and the Spirit possessed me, and I heard a voice behind me, shouting like a trumpet, 'Write down all that you see in a book.' I turned round to see who had spoken to me, and when I turned I saw seven golden lamp- stands and, surrounded by them, a figure like the Son of man, dressed in a long robe tied at the waist with a golden girdle. When I saw him, I fell in a dead faint at his feet, but he touched me with his right hand and said, 'Do not be afraid; it is I, the First and the Last; I am the Living One. I was dead and now I am to live for ever and ever, and I hold the keys of death and of the underworld. Now write down all that you see of present happenings and things that are still to come.'

The word of the Lord

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Jn 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.' Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
