An Audit undertaken of the A/Cs of the four parishes in Imeall Boirne was completed recently. The policy of Killaloe Diocese is to audit Pastoral Areas / Parishes regularly. This is to adhere to the requirements of the Charities Regulator. Among the recommendations was the publication of A/Cs 2024 which was duly done earlier this year. Other recommendations was to reconsider the use of Collection Baskets, the bringing forward of the Collection Baskets at an appropriate time during Mass and procedures for the counting of the monies. Other recommendations proposed by the Audit are being addressed so that all who volunteer are supported in giving of their time to the life of the parishes and facilitating the efficient running of our parishes. A big thank you to all our volunteers who make sure we can gather as a praying community.
