

Year A (2025-26) The Year of St. Matthew

Each year, the season of Advent marks the beginning of a new Church Year, and a new year in the three-year liturgical cycle. This year (2025—26) is Year A, when we read the Gospel according to Matthew on most Sundays. Matthew, Mark and Luke are referred to as synoptic Gospels (from the Greek, 'seeing together'), and they share more or less the same theology and vision of Jesus. By the time of writing, Peter and Paul had both died and Christianity had spread and developed. It is generally agreed that Matthew was an educated Jewish Christian of the second generation, who knew Greek well. He was apparently writing for a Jewish audience, and so makes no attempt to explain Jewish customs. His style is conversational, giving us a portrait of Jesus as the supreme Teacher. He writes excellent Greek but also refers constantly to Hebrew thought and poetry. No other evangelist makes so much use of the Old Testament.
