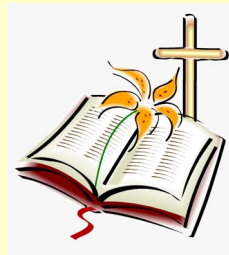

*Our Lord has a few things to tell
us in the Gospel today .*



Firstly, He tells us that intellectual pride blinded some of the people of His day, “the learned and the clever” - to the presence of God in His person; the power of God in His miracles and the kindness and love of God in His words. Only the humble of heart could recognise Him then. And accept Him then.

The same is true today.

Then He tells us that faith is a gift, - Faith in God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is a gift not store bought or found in a science Lab or somehow learned from a book. It is a gift He chose to give us and why he chose us only He knows.

Thirdly there is a legend that Jesus the carpenter in Nazareth made the best fitting yoke in all of Galilee. People came from far and wide with their oxen to be fitted with “Yokes by Jesus “but it is not only animals that have loads to haul and burdens to carry, so do people.

Jesus in His day offered to share the burdens of the weary and worn out– their sickness their pain, their hunger their failure, even the weight of all our sins. We are the body of Christ today -His mystical body.

Our voices must encourage the weary, our hands lift the load from workworn shoulders our help bandage up the world’s wounded.

God help us find the mercy the money and the strength to do it or at least to try.

Synod is a sign of gentle listening

The four verbs of the journey: Remember, Interpret, Orient & Celebrate

The implementation process is structured in several stages, marked by four verbs. First, "to **remember**," helping communities live "a dynamic of exchange between Churches that nourishes communion and supports mission," not by repeating the initial listening phase but by "welcoming" what has already emerged. Then "to **interpret**," in order to read shared dynamics and tensions; "to **orient**," opening the Church to new perspectives; and finally "to **celebrate**," bringing the journey undertaken back to the goal of unity.
